When the Mexican border was scheduled to close back in March 2020, Jody left to “visit” the US for a “short” time. Six months later she was able to return. During the time in the states she participated in creating COVID-19 training materials that were distributed to many nations through their website and cell phones, along with various training seminars.

In October, Jody’s mother was battling a recurring cancer. Jody was able to come to Rochester to spend some time with her and visit local supporting churches. Upon returning she began leading online children’s Bible studies with BTI- “Beloved Truth International”. Additionally she helped teach a Global Health and Tropical Medicine course with the Christian Health Service Corps.

In March, Jody was notified that her mother, Mary Ellen, was in her last days. Jody was able to see her prior to her mother going to be with the Lord at the age of 94.

The Celtic cross reminds us, as Presbyterians, of our historical roots in the British Isles dating back at least to the fifth century. *Post Tenebras Lux* is a Latin slogan from the 16th-century Protestant Reformation meaning *After Darkness, Light*. The cross and the slogan combine to express our desire to be rooted in the ancient faith and to embrace the attainments of the Protestant Reformation.
