Missions Work Highlight

STEPHEN & LAURA SPANJER

Stephen first came to in Neuenburg am Rhein in Southwest Germany in 1997 as a baseball coach of a small club called the Neuenburg Atomics. Through strong relationships with the locals, he and another Christian brother started Bible studies in their basement apartment, using pizza boxes as their blackboard. Stephen was ordained in the PCA in 2006 and sent back to Neuenburg as a Pastor-Evangelist to plant a church with the handful of Christians in that community. The first worship service of the Neuenburg International Church (NIC) was held on Easter morning, 2008. Stephen's ministry continues to use sports as an inroad to local German communities and the church has grown slowly over the years.

NIC currently has 70 members with 3 elders and 3 deacons. In 2020 the church was able to join a local Presbyterian and Reformed denomination called the ERKWB. It was imperative for the sake of building local leadership that the NIC become a member of a linguistically German denomination, however there were no Reformed denominations in Germany when they moved there in 2007. By God's grace they found this small denomination made up of Swiss and Austrian Reformed churches and were able to join them. The NIC is the first German church in the denomination, but it is our goal is to add more by way of evangelism, faithful Bible teaching, and church planting.
