With Mission to The World in South Africa

As in the US, we have been greatly impacted by Covid in South Africa. Nonetheless, we have been able to resume face-to-face ministry activities, including classroom teaching at the Bible Institute, pastor's reading group, and conference speaking on Role of Deacon. Tim's role as MTW Regional Director for Southern Africa has been more impacted due to travel restrictions arising from COVID. A 10 year plan for future ministry is in draft stage, awaiting in-person meetings with various national partners to finalize collaboration MTW aspires to assist with Reformed and Presbyterian church planting and denomination building in several locations in the region. PRAY for timely completion of this plan. PRAY for the newly formed Southern Africa Reformed Mission (Tim is chair). Seeking to raise \$100K to support 3 reformed and Presbyterian planting projects.
