Missions Work Highlight

ADAM GORDON, ALL 4 JESUS MINISTRIES

Today's Great Commission Focus is upon Adam Gordon and the strategic mission of All 4 Jesus Ministries, Inc. Its mission "to fulfill the great commission and to ignite a passion in others to do the same," is pursued by working with local Gospel centered churches, conducting gospel outreaches in towns and cities, and investing deeply in the lives of college students. Accordingly, two multi-week evangelism classes were conducted this summer. God provided several fine young men who having taken the evangelism training, regularly shared the gospel in 1 to 1 witness along with Adam on the streets of Poughkeepsie, Beacon, New Paltz and Pawling NY. For returning-students, four bible study groups at New Paltz and two at Orange have commenced, and weekly leadership meetings for the students launched. WPC's Prof. James Phillips RE, is a regular guest speaker at the New Paltz meetings. Weekly Gospel outreaches are planned for Orange and New Paltz. During freshman outreach, 80 Bibles were given out and connections made with students who became involved with the bible study groups. Some are brand new to Christianity and their growth is exciting.

We joyfully celebrate with Adam and his wife Karla as their first wedding anniversary approaches. Please join with them in earnest prayer that the Lord grant them a more spacious residence for building their family and as a base for ministry.

The Celtic cross reminds us, as Presbyterians, of our historical roots in the British Isles dating back at least to the fifth century. *Post Tenebras Lux* is a Latin slogan from the 16th-century Protestant Reformation meaning *After Darkness, Light*. The cross and the slogan combine to express our desire to be rooted in the ancient faith and to embrace the attainments of the Protestant Reformation.
